Ted Day is the Executive Vice President of Strategic Planning and Business Development for University Health System in San Antonio, Texas.

Mr. Day is a 25+ year veteran of the healthcare industry having served in diverse leadership roles across the industry, including in large health systems, multi-specialty physician practices, and for managed care payers.

In his work in University Health System, Mr. Day is responsible for a range of organizational functions including helping to set and execute the strategic direction of the organization, in concert with the CEO. He also serves as the lead builder of strategic partnerships between the health system and various organizations. He oversees such key system growth and partnership development functions as business development, marketing and corporate communications, regional outreach development, and physician and joint venture contracting.

He has been the executive in charge of the Regional Healthcare Partnership (Region 6) anchor work for a twenty county region of the Texas 1115 Medicaid Transformation Waiver since its inception. This initiative is key in building and connecting new components of healthcare delivery between various types of providers and organizations in order to better meet community needs.

Mr. Day is a champion of the growth and effectiveness of the health care and bioscience industry in San Antonio and the region. He supports that growth in various ways, including through his years of service on the board of directors for BioMed SA. He was elected Vice Chair of the BioMed SA board effective in 2020 and has played an integral leadership role in guiding organizational transition.

Prior to working at University Health System, he was a regional vice president with Christus Health. Before that time, he served in various roles at a national consulting firm, at the University of Colorado Health integrated delivery system, at Spalding Rehabilitation Hospital, and in regional and national health plans.

Mr. Day received his Master of Science in Health Administration and Master of Business Administration degrees from the University of Colorado. He is a candidate for fellowship in the American College of Healthcare Executives. He has served the community on other not-for-profit boards, including the United Way, on a regional community housing development board, and on organizational governance boards for physician hospital organizations and managed care payers.
